Powerful knowledge

God chose a Jewish young woman called Mary, who was engaged to Joseph the carpenter, to be the mother of his earthly son. He sent his angel, Gabriel, to ask this of her. Mary agreed to allow this to happen and Jesus was born in Bethlehem. This is the Christian concept of "incarnation": God becoming man or literally being "made flesh". In Christianity, God is all-powerful but when he came to earth, he expressed vulnerability. Jesus was born in a stable and was visited by a variety of people from very different social classes such as the shepherds and the wise men. There is a significance to the people and places which appear in the Christmas story. Each of the characters have a different viewpoint which help Christians understand the meaning of the birth of Jesus. Slightly different accounts of the story are found in the gospels of Luke and Matthew.

What I already know:

• Christians believe that Jesus is God and that he was born as a baby in Bethlehem. • The Bible points out that his birth showed that he was extraordinary (for example, he is worshipped as a king, in Matthew) and that he came to bring good news (for example, to the poor, in Luke). • Christians celebrate Jesus' birth; Advent for Christians is a time of getting ready for Jesus' coming.
