Big Question

How can I search effectively?

Key Vocabulary for the unit:

Website: A series of web pages and other content, which can be discovered and read through an internet browser.

Search engine: A way for a user to search the internet's database of information.

WebCrawler: A program that uses keywords to search the WWW in a logical and systematic way to find the most suitable results for the user.

Index: A computer saves key information about previously searched results, to make this quicker next time they are accessed.

WWW: The acronym used to express the 'World Wide Web'.

Page rank: Web pages are sorted in an order to give the user the most suitable results at the top of the list, the first result could be considered rank one.

TASK: Title, Author, Summary, Kids.

Data Leak: When information is released without approval from the owner or creator.

Data privacy: The right to keep information private.

Fake news: False and inaccurate information that is shared in a convincing way, usually on social media and in websites.

Inaccurate information: When information is false and untrue.

- To understand that anyone can create a website and therefore we should take steps to check the validity of websites.
- To know that web crawlers are computer programs that crawl through the internet.
- To understand what copyright is.
