School Attendance and punctuality this week

Please remember that notifying us of a child's appointment or absence must be done either by leaving a message on the school phone or you can message Mrs Wren on School Gateway or Dojo. Mrs Wren is the first point of contact for attendance matters relating to absences or time off for appointments in school time.

The class with the best attendance this week is Reception class with 97.12%

The class this week with the least number of late arrivals, was Year 5. The overall attendance for school this week was 91.04%.

March "Give it 100%"

This week sees the start of the "Give it 100% initiative on 1st March. Each week, children will be rewarded for either 100% attendance or authorised absences. At the end of this period on the 28th March, all children that have achieved 100% attendance/or any authorised absences will receive a certificate. Hopefully you will see that this initiative is not to punish anyone for having a genuine reason to be off school, but instead to encourage good attendance and punctuality.

Our Board of Governor's Needs You!

We currently have several vacancies for Foundation Governor's and a Parent Governor on our Governing Body. For Parent Governor's there is no special requirements other than being a parent of a child currently attending the school. For a Foundation Governor you don't need to be a parent of a child in the school but you will need to be able to affirm our Church of England ethos.

We want to make sure the school remains a place where children feel they are cherished, challenged and children of God.

What's involved?

As Governor's, we meet every term, usually for two meetings (six in total each academic year). The meetings are usually between an hour to two hours in length (depending on how much work we have to do), and usually take place in the evening. You will be expected to read up on papers relevant to the meeting and participate in the discussions at the meeting.

You will need to be motivated and keen to learn, but induction training is provided, and there is plenty of opportunity for personal development and growth.

For the Parent Governor role, we are particularly interested in parents from the earlier years in school (Key Stage 1) as those years are underrepresented in our Governing Body.

For the Foundation Governor roles, we would particularly welcome applicants from an education background and people with finance and budgeting experience, but we would be happy to hear from anyone with an interest in this role.

If you or a family member are interested in becoming a Parent Governor or Foundation Governor, please either get in touch with the school office to express interest or if you have more questions please feel free to speak to either Timothy Payne or Linda Dray who are current Governor's and can be found on the bottom playground during drop off most mornings.
