

Powerful knowledge

- Not all cabins on the Titanic were the same. People with lots of money travelled first class. This meant their rooms were very posh. Sometimes, meals in the first class restaurants had ten different parts.
- Second class passengers had a library and their own walking areas on the ship called promenades. The cabins were quite nice.
- People who travelled in third class usually didn't have much money. The cabins were near the ship's engines so could be noisy. There were only two baths between 700 people. Third class passengers weren't allowed to go in the first or second class



Timeline





April 10th 1912 12pm

RMS Titanic sets sail from Southampton on its maiden voyage.

April 14th 1912 11.40pm

The lookout on the ship sees an iceberg ahead. The Titanic tried to steer round it but it hits on starboard side. Water begins to pour into the ship.

April 15th 1912 12.05am

Lifeboats are lowered - there is only room for half of the passengers on board the lifeboats.

April 15th 1912 12.25am

Another ship, the Carpathia, receives the distress call and sails as quickly as possible to help the Titanic.

April 15th 1912 2.20am

The Titanic sinks further under water and the rear of the ship breaks off. The ship is pulled under water.

April 15th 1912 8.50am

The Carpathia rescues 705 passengers and crew before making its way to New York.
