compass	A piece of equipment that tells you what direction you are travelling in. The main compass points are north, south, east and west.
direction	The position towards which someone or something moves or faces.
islets	A small island
native	Something or someone who is from / born in that place.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The UK is bordered by four seas: to the South by the English Channel, to the East by the North Sea, to the West by the Irish Sea and the Atlantic Ocean. ○ Continents – Asia, Europe, Africa, South America, North America, Oceania/ Australasia, Antarctica. ○ Oceans – Atlantic, Pacific, Indian, Arctic and Southern (Antarctic). ○ A compass can have 4 points – North, East, South and West. When people plan a journey, they might use maps and a compass to help them. ○ The Galápagos consist of 13 major islands, 6 smaller islands, and many islets in the Pacific Ocean near South America. The Galápagos were formed by volcanoes. Some of the volcanoes are still active. The islands are famous for having native animals that aren't found anywhere else. 	Skills: Critical thinking
