



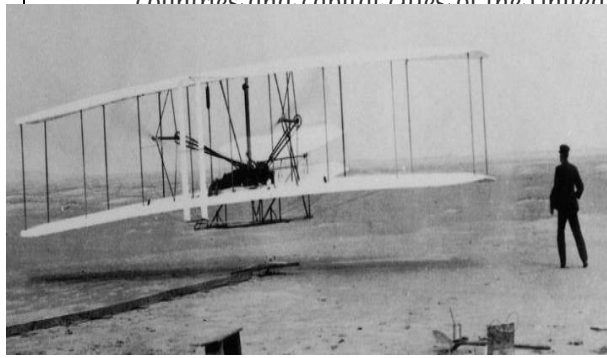
Key Vocabulary	
<b>Flight</b>	The action or process of flying through the air.
<b>Significant</b>	Important.
<b>Invention</b>	Something which has been created for the first time.
<b>Aviation</b>	To operate an aircraft
<b>Aircraft</b>	An aeroplane, helicopter or other machine that can fly.
<b>Positive</b>	Good – the opposite of negative.
<b>Negative</b>	Bad – the opposite of positive.
<b>Sea</b>	The seas around the UK coastline: the north Seas, The Irish Sea, the English Channel, Atlantic Ocean
<b>Ocean</b>	A large area of sea.
<b>United Kingdom</b>	A island made up of four countries – England, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales.

Powerful knowledge	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Orville and Wilbur Wright (the Wright brothers) successfully completed the first powered flight in 1903 on the 17th of December.</li> <li>Changes: The world's first jet propelled aircraft was made in 1910, while the first crossing to America was in 1919. The first airliner flight that carried passengers was in 1957. Concorde took its first test flight in 1962 and was the fastest passenger plane.</li> <li>Bessie Coleman was the first black and the first Native American female pilot. She became a stunt pilot and performed all over the USA and taught others how to fly.</li> <li>Positives of flight – you can bring goods to remote locations, go to any location easily, transport soldiers and mail, spray crops with insecticide and fertiliser, travel to various locations easily and quicker than by boat.</li> <li>Negatives of flight – air pollution and land pollution, materials for all the failed attempts cost money, lots of people died when testing their failed attempts at inventing the airplane.</li> </ul>
