



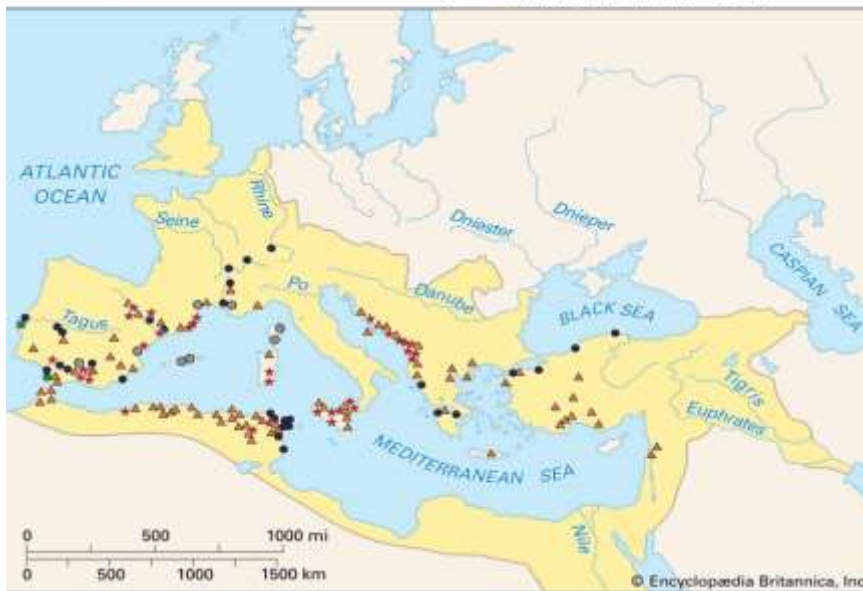
Key Vocabulary	
Atlas	A book of maps
Key	A symbol used to provide further information on a map, this information is often in a box
Human characteristics	Human characteristics include the size and density of the population, and other aspects of the culture. Human characteristics also includes the built environment, such as houses, roads, and other infrastructure.
Topographical features	A topographical survey or map relates to or shows the physical features of an area of land, for example its hills, valleys, and rivers.
Colony	An area under control of another country, occupied by settlers of another country
Municipium	In ancient Rome, the Latin term municipium referred to a town or city.
